<p>Step 1: Submission of new project template to SISCC core team</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ template and guidance for completion will be available on new SISCC website; ○ key contact / responsible person identified for new proposal; ○ initial / background discussion with SISCC Associate Directors.
<p>Step 2: Assessment of topics and priorities against SISCC criteria</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ policy priorities, with a strong evidence-base, and readiness for change; ○ consideration of our remit to strengthen the evidence base for large scale sustained change in health and social care, with potential for impact on our four outcome domains; ○ findings of SISCC and other work that indicates fruitful ways forward; ○ opportunities that open doors for timely development of our work; ○ likelihood of future external funding.
<p>Step 3: Assessment and peer review by the Executive Group</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ extensive knowledge and expertise to provide added value to proposals; ○ peer review process to ensure the quality of the proposals; ○ external partners to provide input on the wider improvement landscape (HIS, NES etc) identifying opportunities to support existing work; ○ review financial and resource implications.
<p>Step 4: Annual prioritisation process for commissioning major new work</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ an annual review and consultation timeline will be developed around Executive Group and Board meetings; ○ it will provide an opportunity for Board and Funders to input into the prioritisation and commissioning of major new proposals that use core resource.; <p>annual workplan enables resources, budgets and opportunities to be managed in a proactive way</p>

Commissioning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ provides similar governance of Executive Group review and input from the Executive Group, external core partners, the Board and Funders;○ enables responsive response to requests and opportunities to develop the self-sustainable funding model.
